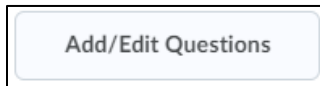
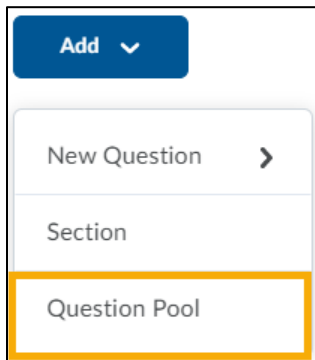


# Using and Implementing Question Pools

1. From your **Edit Quiz homepage**, let's pop over to the add/edit questions page by clicking the white **Add/Edit Questions** button.



2. Now, let's click the blue **Add** button and select Question Pool.



3. Now, let's create a title for our pool.

A form field with a light gray border. The label "Question Pool Title \*" is at the top. The input field contains the text "Gilded Age/Progressive Era".

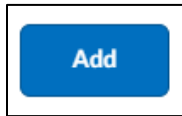
4. Let's choose our questions now. Use the white **Browse Question Library** button to select questions from your **question library**. Unfortunately, there is no way to directly add questions to a pool from this page.




5. Next, select the questions you would like to import. If you have sections, you can click the white arrow next to the section name to view individual questions. Click the checkbox next to the question or section you would like to import.



6. Then, click the blue **Add** button.



7. Now, you can choose how many questions students will be given to answer and how many points each question is worth. For example, I have 15 questions to draw from, and I want to create a 5-question quiz worth 10 points. So, my question pool set-up would look like the following:

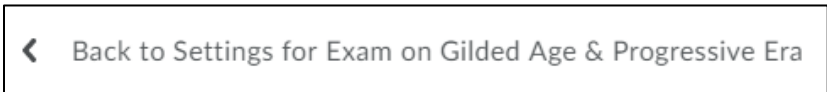

8. When you have finished your question pool set-up, click the blue **Save** button.

9. Click the **Back to Settings for...** button. You will see your question set up. It should look similar to the picture below:



10. You can see the **Type** is set to **RND**, which indicates the pool will populate 5 random questions from your pool.
